- Total cats and dogs spayed: 275
- Total pounds of pet food distributed: 714 lbs.
- Total dogs and cats vaccinated: 47

In an effort to promote responsible pet ownership and ensuring no pet ever goes hungry, we offer a pet food pantry for those in need. This month we distributed 266 lbs. of cat food and 448 lbs. of dog food to pets in need. We owe a big "thank you" to all of our volunteers and those who've donated to the pantry. Without their help, we never would have been able to achieve this.

This Month's Microchip/Vaccine Clinic

Our volunteer team carved time out of their Sunday mornings on October 9th to help give out low cost vaccines and microchips to 47 dogs and cats in need. Dr Sydney Medina, a vet at the Animal Care Center of Hays County, lent us her talents to ensure all vaccines and microchips were administered safely, and we couldn't be more grateful. We were able to give microchips for only \$10 and vaccines ranging from \$7-\$25. If you missed it, our next clinic will be on the morning of Nov. 27th.
